About Us

Keviyut.

First and foremost, we encourage and enable our students to study both Torah and their secular studies at university to the highest standards. Our Beit Midrash programme is organised around the university schedule, creating a life filled with Torah. Our shiurim are stimulating and challenging, fostering continued curiosity and engagement with Talmud Torah. We inspire our fellows to value learning Torah as a central part of their schedule even when they need to seek it out for themselves.

We teach our students to balance a multitude of Torah values, emerging from their undergraduate years as strong bnot Torah. They will learn skills of analysis as a path to truth, and middot as a path to kiddush Hashem in the wider world.

We push beyond the Beit Midrash to teach our students to live lives filled with meaning, seeking greater and closer connection with Hashem in every part of their lives - in the Beit Midrash, in the library, at work and at home. Our shiurim address ways that we can harness our Torah and secular studies to better understand and help our world.

Just as we encourage our students to fill their daily life with learning Torah, so too their modern worldview should be filtered through a Torah lens. While sefarim are a start to understanding this, role-models are key. Our students are able to speak to our programme directors and teachers one-on-one. In addition, we are privileged to host exceptional rebbeim and scholars from Yeshiva University each year in London who support our own team of teachers.

While our fellowship only requires our students to sign up for a year, we highly encourage them to stay on as fellows for all the years they are studying in university. Our curriculum builds year to year, developing exceptional, inspired and deeply rooted graduates who will help Am Yisrael grow from strength to strength.

Fellowship Responsibilities

Your commitment is for one year of your degree, although we very much hope that you will stay on and continue learning with us throughout your degree! The Fellowship is open for students in all years of their undergraduate studies.

Beit Midrash Attendance

During term-time there are four sessions each week with a variety of different shiurim - discussion based classes, chavruta and shiur, and chaburot. They run on Sunday mornings, Wednesday afternoons and Tuesday and Thursday night in our Beit Midrash. Our fellows choose three of these sessions to commit to and can be flexible about which slots they choose term to term if their university commitments change.

Scholar-In-Residence Participation

Four times a year, top educators and Rebbeim from Yeshiva University will be visiting London specifically to learn with our programme and spend time with our students. Students are expected to be at a couple of additional shiurim with these speakers on weeks when the speakers are visiting (arranged around student schedules).

Certificate in Judaic Studies from Yeshiva University

We are privileged to work with YU Global, an advanced online learning platform. In advance of our Yeshiva University speakers coming in person, fellows have the opportunity to deepen their learning from some of these speakers by completing short online modules based on the material the speaker is expert in. The courses are custom-made for us and will reflect Shalem's values, interests and goals. By completing all eight modules over the course of three years, fellows have the opportunity to complete a Certificate in Judaic Studies offered by Yeshiva University. Fellows are required to complete at least one of these modules per year of their fellowship.

Some examples of courses:

- Shaping the Shevatim: Family Dynamics & the Development of Israel's 12 Tribes
- Jewish Interpersonal Ethics & Business Applications
- 'Words, Words, Words': Hashgacha, Hashkafa & Hamlet.

Stipend

Stipends will be paid to all our Fellows in termly instalments. Receiving a full stipend will be conditional on attendance (barring exceptional circumstances, and university commitments).

Trip to Stern College, NY

All our fellows are invited to an all expenses paid trip to learn in Stern College in the winter holidays! We will be learning in their Beit Midrash, attending Torah classes and meeting and learning from exceptional Torah teachers and Rebbeim there. Of course it's also an amazing opportunity to catch up with friends from the States and see some sites in Manhattan!

We also hosted a networking dinner, meeting with exceptional baalei batim who are at the executive level of their chosen careers, as well as making time for Torah learning and involvement in their communities.

Rabbi Daniel Feldman

Rabbi Daniel Z. Feldman is a Rosh Yeshiva at the Rabbi Isaac Elchanan Theological Seminary at Yeshiva University, as well as an instructor in the Sy Syms School of Business, and has taught for the Wurzweiler School of Social Work and the Katz School of Continuing Education. He also serves as the Executive Editor of the RIETS initiative of YU Press.
