Why Join Shalem?

Keviyut.

- We encourage and enable our students to study both Torah and their secular subjects at university to the highest standards. Our Beit Midrash programme is organised around the YOUR schedule, to make this possible.
- We offer a wide range of shiurim in our diverse weekly schedule, which are stimulating, inspiring and challenging, fostering continued curiosity and ongoing engagement with Talmud Torah.
- We give our students the opportunity to learn Torah as a path to truth, and to develop middot to make a kiddush Hashem in the wider world.

Shleimut.

- We push beyond the Beit Midrash to teach our students to live lives filled with meaning, seeking greater and closer connection with HaKadosh Baruch Hu in every part of their lives - in the Beit midrash, in the library, at work and at home.

Fellowship Responsibilities

Your commitment is for one year of your degree, although we very much hope that you will stay on and continue learning with us throughout your degree! The Fellowship is open for students in all years of their undergraduate studies.

Beit Midrash Attendance

During term-time there are four sessions each week with a variety of different shiurim - discussion based classes, chavruta and shiur, and chaburot. They run on Sunday mornings, Wednesday afternoons and Tuesday and Thursday nights in our Beit Midrash. Our fellows choose three of these sessions to commit to on a weekly basis.

Stipend

Stipends will be paid to all our Fellows in termly instalments. Receiving a full stipend will be conditional on attendance (barring exceptional circumstances, and university commitments).

Shana Bet students will receive a higher stipend, and benefit from some special Shana Bet shiurim and sessions.

Certificate in Judaic Studies

We are privileged to work with YU Global, an advanced online learning platform. In advance of our Yeshiva University teachers coming in person, fellows have the opportunity to complete short online modules based on the material the speaker is expert in. By completing seven modules over the course of three years, fellows have the opportunity to complete a **Certificate in Judaic Studies** offered by Yeshiva University. Fellows are required to complete **at least one** of these modules per year of their fellowship.
